I've just received the response below from Pie:

Dear Stacey - thank you for sending me the poems to look at and for dipping into Ramshackle Rainbow which is an anthology that I love - great cover and some lovely poems as well.

There are lots of poems in the book that are like an invitation and the children can have a go at doing something similar, e.g. Benediction, Clouds, poem to be spoken silently, Cat began, horse, dazzledance, yes, Atlantic roundhouse, a boy's head, warning, she, she is, the door, wings, the magic box, the magical mouse - all of these provide a structure and poetry idea that can be used by the children. There are lots of ideas in my book Jumpstart poetry! And, there are other poetry models and teaching notes on our website.

Waves of Wonder, by Annabelle, has some very good turns of phrase 'as elegant as a buffallo', the ocean conceals, etc. It was a well sustained piece - had she been looking at The Sea is a hungry dog? Rainbow, by Luke was a good stab at an acrostic and I wonder what he would write without the restriction of the pattern. The Rollercoaster of life, by Evie-Jaide, is an interesting piece and has some memorable phrases such as the 'anonymous scrapings'- it's interesting to see someone exploring an idea in a sustained way. The poems are at their best when the language and imagery is unique to the writer so well done and great work.

Thanks for sending them to me and do let the children that I loved their work and have printed it out to put on my pinboard to make me happy!
