British Values in English

At Brunshaw Primary School, we develop and promote British Values throughout our school and within our curriculum. A key part of our plan for education is to ensure children become valuable and fully rounded members of society who treat others with respect and leave school fully prepared for life in modern Britain.

In the subject area of English, we promote British Values in the following ways:

The Rule of Law

- We take turns to talk and share ideas.

Democracy

- During our speaking and listening activities we debate and discuss of issues raised in texts
- We listen to the viewpoints of others when discussing texts and using them to develop our own ideas.

Individual Liberty

- Y4 Text - We read *The Egyptian Cinderella* - we explore issues around slavery
- Y5 Texts - We read *The Arrival* & *The Boy at the Back of the Class* - we explore individual liberty
- During Black History Week, we use texts to support work around the issues of individual liberty and we learn about those people who fought for this right.

Mutual Respect

- We develop our understanding of the viewpoint of others through inference our skills
- We are taught units of non-fiction work which include persuasive writing and balanced arguments covering a wide range of topics
- Y2 Texts - We read Tom Percival books. We learn about how to get along with and understand others
- We listen respectfully, to the ideas of others.

Tolerance for those of different faiths and beliefs

- Y1 Texts - We read *Ana Hibiscus* / *Handa's surprise*
- Y3 Text - We read *Young, Gifted and Black*
- Y4 Text - We read *Shadow*
- We have got a range of texts to share in classes to help us empathise with ongoing issues in Afghanistan
- Y5 Text - We read the true story of *Four Black Women In Space*
