Although it is rich in natural resources and has a lot of fertile land, more than one-third of Australia is desert. The United Kingdom is a country in north-western Europe. No location in the UK is further away from the sea than 125 km/77 miles! The living standards in Austrailia are noticably higher than in the UK. This is also accompained with higher average wages. Australia's oceans and seas include those off the mainland and its offshore territories in the Pacific, Southern and Indian Oceans as well as the Timor, Tasman and Coral Seas. The UK is bordered by four seas: to the South by the English Channel, which separates it from continental Europe. to the East by the North Sea. to the West by the Irish Sea and the Atlantic Ocean.
