The seafront consists of a 7-mile sandy beach, with a flat coastline in the south of the district. Blackpool has three piers, the North (built in 1863), Central (1868) and South (1893). Blackpool Tower, built in May 1894, is a 518-foot-tall copy of the Eiffel Tower. Blackpool has, like all of the UK, a temperate maritime climate. Coasts are changed by nature and humans. Changes can be caused as the sea erodes the land. Because of these changes, coasts have many different features, such as beaches, cliffs, islands and caves.
