What should I already know? - A small area within a contrasting non-European country. - Be aware of its broader geographical context, such as the country/continent in which it is located. - Explore similarities and differences between the small area being studied and areas with which they are more familiar with. - Ask simple geographical, ‘where?’, ‘what?’, and ‘who?’ questions about the world and their environment e.g. ‘What is it like to live in this place?’ - Investigate through observation and description. - Recognise differences between their own and others’ lives. 		Facts I will learn - There are 15 National Parks in the UK. - All National Parks must have stunning natural beauty, beautiful wildlife and fascinating cultural heritage. - Glaciation and volcanic activity from the past has influenced the physical geography of the Lake District. - The human geography of the Lake District focuses around tourism and farming. - The Lake District attracts vast amounts of tourists a year due to its physical features.		Key questions - What is a National Park? - What is the physical geography of the Lake District like? - How have geographical processes (changes) affected the landscape? - What is the human geography of the Lake District like? - Why does the Lake District attract tourists and what impact does this have on the area? - How does the Lake District compare with our own locality?
