Facts I will learn • Fair trade allows farmers, producers and artisans to be paid a fair price for the things they make and to have better working conditions. • There are 6000 Fairtrade products available worldwide - over 4,500 of these are sold in the UK. These include bananas, tea, coffee, and chocolate. • Fairtrade products are sold in 120 countries. • The first product to get the Fairtrade Mark was Green and Black's Maya Gold chocolate bar in 1994. (Relate to world biomes.) How does our food get to us? How is food transported? How many miles does it travel? How does it stay fresh? Which food is grown and which is reared?
