1 Shared Human Experience	To know that family is a group of two or more persons related by birth, marriage, or adoption who live together; all such related persons are considered as members of one family To understand that for most people parents and caregivers are legally responsible for providing for their children until they become adults. In most states, children legally become adults at 18 years old. Parents are responsible for attending to their child's basic needs, including: Food, clothing, and housing To know that they have an active participation in family events, sharing their opinion, being truthful, and completing age appropriate chores To know that the adults' role is to facilitate a child's journey toward gaining independence and discipline.
