To know that Abraham left his home as God instructed and God would promise to "bless his family" and he would go onto have many children and descendants (even though he was in his 80's). 4	To know what it means to make a promise to someone and why people put their trust in God. To know that Noah and believed in God and knew God would keep his promise to him. To understand Noah trusted God and promised to build the Ark and he would save him. 5	To understand what the festival Sukkot is and why this important to Jews To know how the celebration of the Sukkot is similar/different to the celebrations some people celebrate each year To know a sukkah or succah is a temporary hut constructed for use during the week-long Jewish festival of Sukkot To know that Sukkot is a time for the Jews to remember to be grateful to God for keeping his promise and providing them with all that they need when they left Egypt as slaves To know that the etrog, lulav, aravah and hadass are bound together and waved in the sukkah to send blessings out to all creation	What is the festival of Sukkot and how is this a time when the Jews thank God for looking after them? To know that Christians put their hands together when they pray as a gesture of peace and good intentions, and close their eyes to show a private interaction between them and God To know that Christians light candles to show that they are entering the light of God and hold use aids to help them pray To know that the lord's prayer is the words Jesus gave directly to his followers and that we are praying with and for others and not ourselves	What words, rituals and items are used in Christian prayer and why this/these are done?
