2	To understand that there are Five Pillars of Islam and The Five Pillars of Islam are five duties that Muslims try to carry out. It helps them to live a good and responsible life, and bring them closer to God (Allah) and their community To know Hajj is one of The Five Pillars of Islam. Hajj is the pilgrimage to Mecca that every Muslim must make at least once in their lifetime if they are able; it is the most spiritual event that a Muslim experiences, observing rituals in the most sacred places in the Islamic world To know that Mecca is in a desert valley in western Saudi Arabia, is Islam's holiest city, as it's the birthplace of the Prophet Muhammad and the faith itself To know a pilgrimage is a trip, often a long one, made to a holy place for religious reasons	What is Hajj and why is it important to Muslims? Recap The Five Pillars of Islam;

1- Shahada - This pillar is the main belief of all Muslim people and it is a declaration of their faith - "There is no god except Allah, Muhammad (PBUH) is the messenger of Allah."

2 – Salah - This pillar is prayer. Muslims pray five times a day and follow a special ritual to do so. First they must wash in symbolically clean water.

All the prayers are said at the same time every day.

Fajr – Morning, between dawn and sunrise

Zuhr – Mid-day or early afternoon

Asr – Late afternoon

Maghrib – Evening, around sunset

Isah – Night, before going to bed

3 – Zakat - This pillar is about looking after other people. Each Muslim gives up a share of his wealth each year to provide for those less fortunate.

The word zakat means to purify or cleanse. As a person gives away a share of their wealth they become cleansed from selfishness and greed.

4 – Sawm - This pillar is all about Ramadan. The ninth month of the Islam calendar is when Muhammad (PBUH) began receiving messages from God.

For 30 days Muslims fast, they do not eat or drink during daylight hours. The fast is to remind them how difficult it is to be poor, hungry and thirsty. It reminds them to thank God for the gift of the Qur'an and not be greedy.

5 – Hajj - All Muslims have a duty to make a pilgrimage to Makkah at least once in their life. Very often whole families will save to send one person at a time. Men who go must wear an ihram which is made up of two sheets which must not be sewn together. Muslims go on the pilgrimage to bring together the community and strengthen it.

	To know that the Five Pillars link and each pillar and helps to support and guide a Muslim to live their life the correct way To know that Ummah is an Arabic word meaning "community" or the worldwide community of Muslims. There is no living leader of the Ummah. Allah is the only one who Muslims follow. The Ummah aims to promote the welfare of everyone in the Muslim community. The Ummah benefits from a shared language – most Muslims learn Arabic so they can read the Qur'an. The Ummah supports the worldwide community of Muslims by: • supporting one another financially, for instance through the giving of Zakah • encouraging the members of the community to take care of one another • encouraging people to live the best life they can and not engage in wrong doing • supporting each other in difficult times such as fasting (Sawm)		
3	To know Hajj is the Fifth Pillar of Islam and is a pilgrimage to a Holy Place – usually Mecca To understand that there are 12 steps/rituals to Hajj; 1 – Intention and Ihram 2 – Tawaf 3 - Sae- Walking and Running Between Al - Safa and Al – Marwa 4 – Spending the night in Mina 5 – Arafah Day 6 - Spending the Night in Muzdalifah 7 – Throwing the Pebbles 8 – The day of the Sacrifice 9 – Shaving their head 10 - Tawaf and Sae Once More 11 – Throwing the Pebbles at The Three Pillars	How important is it for a Muslim to go on Hajj and what does it mean for those who are unable to go make pilgrimage? 	12 – The Farewell Tawaf (See supporting Power Point) To know that the rituals at each stage of Hajj unite the community and strengthen personal faith To know that hajj is an obligation for all Muslims who are physically and financially capable To know that the intention is there for Muslims to make the pilgrimage however if they are unable to make the journey the belief is that they are still rewarded by Allah because with a pure heart they fully intended to go cannot due to restrictions. Many Muslims are denied the right to Hajj due to a lack of space and Saudi Arabia's limited organisational capacity – only allow so many Muslims to do Hajj To understand that some Muslims cannot do Hajj because of age, or severe health conditions or terminal illness		
4	To know guidance is necessary because the need of guidance is something that cannot be ignored by anyone. Guidance helps in the development of educational, employment, and psychological skills in an individual. Guidance would help an individual to achieve the best level of happiness and peace in life To know a journey map of life is visual aid for people to plot their future hopes and goals. They are able to see more clearly the help, support and guidance they may need along the way to be able to achieve the outcomes To be able to reflect on their journey through school and identify what areas they found challenging. 3	To know that Jesus gave strict orders to never tell anyone his Identity as Messiah (saviour of a group of people) until his last journey into Jerusalem on a donkey where he is reveals his identity as Messiah. This is because he knows he has come to the end of his teachings. To know the events leading up to Jesus' death are commemorated in these ways: Jesus arrived in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. The people were happy to see Jesus and waved palm branches. This commemorates Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem The Last Supper is Holy Thursday is the last day of freedom Jesus had before he was arrested. This is when Jesus ate the Last Supper with his disciples, which is still celebrated in Christian churches as Holy Communion To know the Eucharist is the sacrifice of Jesus' death on the cross through a ceremony in church called communion, which is also known as the Eucharist. 	Supper. The Eucharist is referred to by Catholics as Mass and it involves spiritually feeding participants with the body and blood of Christ. To know that there are different denominations of Christianity the three major ones being Roman Catholic, Protestant and Eastern Orthodox (and many more) To know that Christians today often believe that the day is called Good Friday because Jesus died so that everyone could be forgiven for the things they had done wrong. This means that it's the forgiveness that's good, not Jesus's death. The day could also be considered to be good because it's what led to the Resurrection of Jesus		
4	To understand that support means to agree with and give encouragement to someone or something because you want him, her, or it to succeed To know what challenges they may have faced so far – school work, learning a new skill or for others it could be a more difficult challenge based on their home life To understand that people and things can help them overcome their life's challenges so far – teachers, parents, instructors etc To know guidance is the giving of advice or information provided by a person of experience, to solve a problem or improve something To understand that suffering makes you stronger because suffering can help us improve our lives—if we are open to it.
