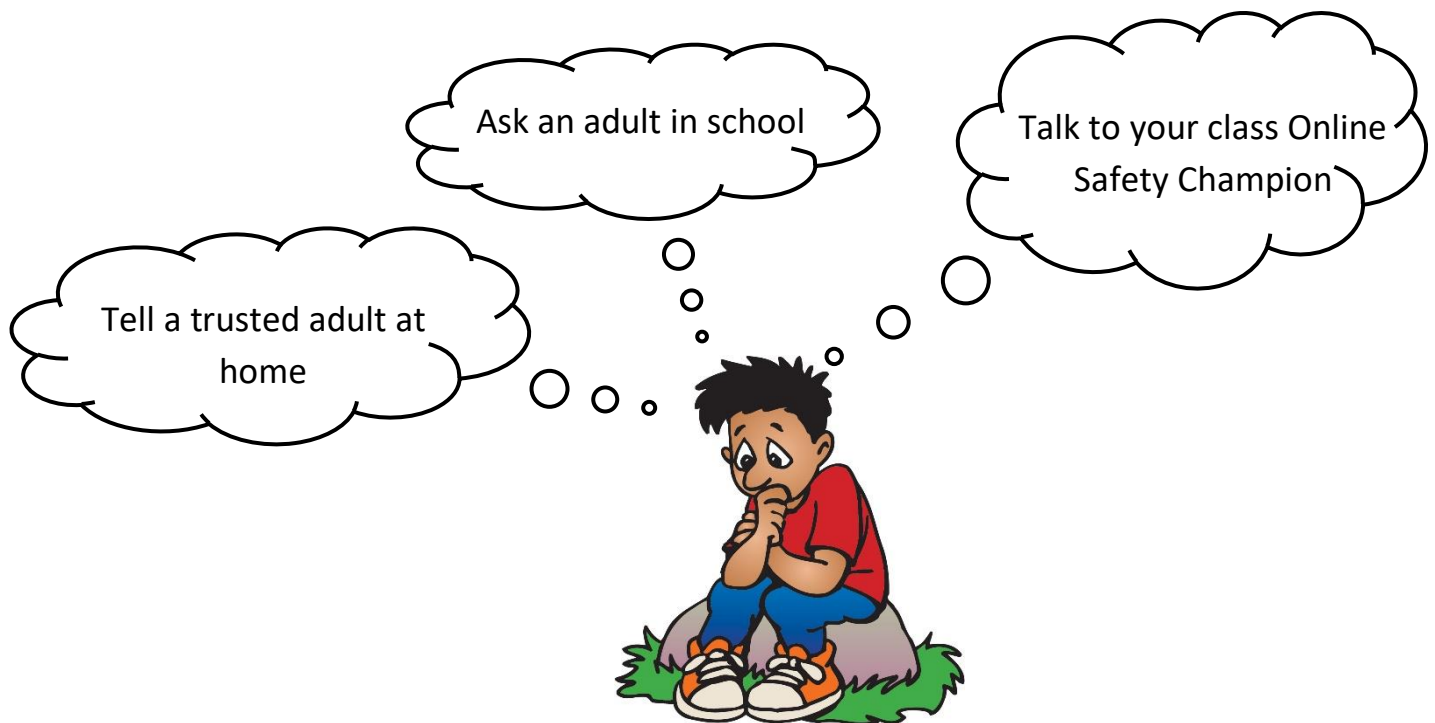
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What is Online Safety?

At Brunshaw Primary School, we enjoy using the internet to learn new things and have fun, but we know that there are some things online that are not meant for children. Each year, we learn lots about these 4 areas of online safety:

Content This area is about what you post and look at online. Is it appropriate for your age?	Contact This area is all about who you are speaking to online. Have you met them in person?
Conduct This area is all about how you act online and how other people act towards you. Is everyone being kind?	Commerce This area is all about recognising tricks used online to get your money. Is the website safe?

How to stay safe online:

- Don't share your passwords and usernames.
- Don't take photos or videos, unless this is for your lesson.
- Take care of school equipment.
- Our teachers monitor our internet searches to keep us safe, so only search for appropriate things.
- If something inappropriate comes up on a laptop or iPad, tell a teacher straight away.
