Title: Why is the Qur'an important to Muslims?
Key Question (to be used all year): Where can we find guidance about how to live out lives?

What should I already know?

- Why Muslims must act and dress modestly
- Muslims believe that bodies are special gifts given to them by Allah
- Muslims believe in one God- Allah
- Islam teaches that humans have a special role to be caretakers of the planet
 - Obedience is a way of showing gratitude to God
- Why prayer is important to Muslims
- Who the Prophet Muhammad is and why he is a good example to Muslims
- Why Muslims give a portion of their wage to charity (zakat)
- Muslims fast during Ramadhan
- The Five Pillars of Islam are the foundations of the Islamic faith and way of life
- Ramadhan is the Islamic month of fasting
- The Night of Power is a special day within Ramadhan.



Facts I will learn

- That Laws are the rules that everyone in the country must follow. Laws are made by a group of people called Parliament. We have laws so to keep everyone safe and to take care of people.
- To know that the Qur'an is a source of wisdom and authority for Muslims.
- The Qur'an is the sacred word of God – The Ultimate Authority. It should be covered, kept on a high shelf and put on a stand when read. Hands should be washed before touching it.
- The Power of the Night is believed to be the night when the first verses of the Holy Qur'an were revealed to the Prophet Muhammad. It is celebrated during Ramadhan and is recited at mosque.
- That we can receive guidance from teachers, coaches, parents, family, health care professionals, friends, online etc



Key questions:

- Where do laws come from? And why are they important?
- Why is the Qur'an important to Muslims?
- How do Muslims demonstrate respect for Allah through the use and treatment of the Qur'an?
- What is the Night of Power and how do Muslims remember it?
- Where do I find Guidance?
