 What should I already know? A mixture of high and low pitched sounds put together make a tune. To be able to match pitch you have to listen carefully. A lullaby is a quiet, gentle song to help babies get to sleep. They are high pitched and have a slow pulse. Ostinato is a repeated tune or rhythm. This is a feature of modern dance music.
