Title: Why do Christians believe Good Friday is good?

Key Question (to be used all year): Is life a journey?

What should I already know?

- To know that beliefs are central to Christianity
- To understand why Christians might think it is important to pray together and worship God
- To know that the church can be used for things other than worship
- To know that belonging to a community is important in Christianity
- What a discipleship is and why Jesus had disciples.
- Why and how Christians follow the example of Jesus through mission and charity work.
- How Christians show commitment during lent.
- How Christians are motivated by their faith.
- What is meant by a miracle.
- That Christians believe that the ultimate miracle performed by Jesus was the resurrection.
- Why some Christians go on pilgrimages.
- That only God has the power over life and death.



Facts I will learn:


- That we face difficulties in life and with the support of others we can overcome them
- That Good Friday is good because even though Jesus was crucified on Good Friday it brings Christians comfort because Jesus was indestructible – he was the son of God
- Holy week is celebrated a week before is Easter and is the most important week in the Church's year
- That we can turn to people we care about and professions when we need help and support
