Facts I will learn:

- To know we show devotion to others with special days, gifts, compliments, time etc
- To know that Hindus believe in one God (Brahman) who can be worshipped in many forms that these forms (the deities) have different qualities that are portrayed in different ways.
- To know the 7 items on the puja tray and that puja means worship
- To know that Hindus worship using the puja at a Mandir and/or home shrine and what the puja's purpose is
- To understand who and what is special to them and why they believe that they are

Key questions:

- How do we show gratitude, respect and devotion to the people that really matter to us?
- What do Hindus believe about God?
- What items are used in Hindu worship?
- What is the purpose and significance of the objects on the puja tray and what happens during the worship?
- Who and what is really special to me?

Key Skills:

- Identify how humans show their gratitude to the people who matter in their lives.
- To reflect on who they should be grateful to and how they might show this.
- To talk about who is special to them and why.

- Celebration assembly, children to design certificate for each person in their class and present to them in their own assembly, invite parents.
