Title: Learie Constantine – Local history

What should I already know?

- I should know how to sequence photographs from different time periods in my life.
- I should know how to use words and phrases like: old, new and a long time ago.
- I should be able to identify some of the basic ways the past can be represented.
- I should be able to identify some similarities and differences between ways of life in the past.
- I should be able to use stories and other sources to show that they know and understand key features of events.

Facts I will learn:

- I will learn what the Trinity Cross was and why it was so special.
- I will learn that Learie Constantine was the best fielder in the world. He played cricket for Lancashire and was the highest paid cricketer in our country a long time ago.
- I will learn that Learie and his family suffered racism.
- I will learn that Learie tried to make it possible for people to get along better.

Key questions:

- What is significance and how does a person become significant?
- What was the Trinity Cross?
- Who was Learie Constantine and what is he remembered for?
- How did Learie Constantine adjust to life in Lancashire/ England?
- Did Learie Constantine make peoples' lives better?
- Who is Learie Constantine and why is he so significant?
